

The manuscript may be limited to 2500 to 4000 words.

The main title should be followed by the name, affiliation, and address of the author(s) with e-mail and contact nos.

The paper should be sent along with the declaration letter stating that the work is the original and not presented/published anywhere else

Papers approved by the conference review committee will be accepted for the oral presentation

The paper should be in MS-word format, font: Times New Roman, Size: 12, space: 1.5 lines, paper size: A4.

Headings & sub headings must be in bold font, justified.

Figures, charts, photos, and tables within the article should have proper numbers and descriptions

The length of the abstract should not be more than 200 words in italics.

Keyword: 2-5 words. for the oral presentation

All references should be presented according to the APA style

All papers must be accompanied by one passportsize colour photograph.

### The Essential of an Article:

The article can include an Introduction, Objectives, Methodology, Expressing Opinion, Impact study, Case Study, Sharing Experience, Analysis and Interpretation, Findings and suggestions, etc.

### **POSTERS:**

The participants can prepare the posters for presentation related to main theme and subthemes of the conference.

Poster size may be approximately 1 m  $\times$  0.5 m, which is roughly equivalent to Six A4 sheets.

The poster should include title, authors name, address, and email. Present Diagrams and charts with explanation.

Posters will be displayed in a designated space at the Conference venue.
