



About North-Eastern Hill University

Established in 1973 by an Act of the Indian Parliament, the North Eastern Hill University (NEHU) is a prominent institution in Shillong, India. It stands as a central institution for promoting education and research in the northeastern region of India. The dual-campus structure in Meghalaya, with locations in both Shillong and Tura, enables the university to cater to a broader base of students and researchers, fostering regional development and accessibility to education.

The university's objectives, as delineated in the NEHU Act of 1973, underline its role in the propagation and progression of knowledge through the provision of instructional and research amenities in various fields; with particular emphasis on fostering the enhancement of social and economic conditions and the well-being of the communities residing in the hilly regions of the North-eastern area, while focusing on intellectual, academic, and cultural development

The **Department of Library and Information Science** was established in 1985 with a new approach to Library and Information Science education in the country. The Department introduced for the first time in the country a two-year integrated programme leading to Master's degree in Library and Information Science. The same pattern of education has now been recommended by the UGC under Model Curriculum in Library & Information Science since 2002. The University Library is being used as a laboratory for the students for practical training under the guidance of faculty members and practicing librarians. Thus, theory and practice are given equal emphasis through this integrated approach.

Since its inception, the Department has produced more than 900 students who have been awarded the Master's degree in Library & Information Science (M.Lib.I. Sc.) and 48 students have been awarded the Ph.D Degree. Many of them are well placed and are working in many senior professional positions as University Teachers, University Librarians, College Librarians, and in professional capacity in various library settings such as the State Central Library, R&D Institutes and in Private Sectors across India and other countries including Nepal, Bangladesh, Canada, Myanmar, Indonesia, Yemen, Ghana, Nigeria and China


